Stats Update

As of February 2014, READ had 36 tutors serving a total of 85 students. Of these students, three were adults who speak English as a first language, 26 spoke English as a second language, 18 were children receiving private tutoring and 38 were children receiving tutoring within a school setting.

Betty Roy, a READ volunteer, recently spent approximately a year meeting with an adult student at the La Porte County Public Library. Betty reports that during that time, the student passed the GED, then continued to attend tutoring sessions to improve her writing skills so she could go to college. "She was rarely absent and we would stay an extra hour each time because she wanted to," says Betty. "It was a pleasure to work with her and I enjoyed the time we were working together."

What We're READing... A Review of Kate Morton's "The House at Riverton" by Michelle Shirk

Fans of the BBC's Downton Abby will find themselves right at home in the world created by Kate Morton in this excellent historical fiction novel. "The House at Riverton" tells the story of an affluent British family through the remembrances of narrator Grace, a former housemaid and later lady's maid to daughter Hannah.

It becomes apparent very early on that the Riverton estate has become infamous as a result of a tragedy that that occurred on the grounds during the 1920s. In fact, the now-elderly Grace's memories of her service to the household are stirred after a filmmaker descends upon her nursing home in service of a film dramatization of this event. However, the "whys" and "hows" of the event create a mystery that Morton unravels slowly and skillfully throughout the novel.

While even the most careful reader will likely encounter a few surprises along the way, each of the novel's twists and turns seems perfectly logical in retrospect. In addition to an intriguing plot, "The House at Riverton" offers fascinating, flawed characters and plenty of interesting historical detail.

Overall, while this novel will require a fair investment of time and attention, the payoff is well worth it. Consider "The House at Riverton" for your next rainy day read or book club selection.
