## What's New with READ?

\*We are pleased to announce that READ has been awarded a \$2000 grant from the Bethany Lutheran Church of La Porte Foundation, Inc. These funds will be used for marketing and training. We greatly appreciate Bethany's continued support of READ's mission!

\*On May 4<sup>th</sup>, READ held a free Tutor Training at La Porte County Library. We had 10 current and potential tutors in attendance. We thank the La Porte County Public Library for hosting us as well as Jimmy John's of La Porte for donating sandwiches for lunch.

\*On May 2<sup>nd</sup>, a team sponsored by READ received 4<sup>th</sup> place in the Literacy Council Executive Spelling Bee. The word that knocked us out of 3<sup>rd</sup> place was "flibbertigibbet."

\*READ has also been awarded a \$2000 grant from the Dollar General Literacy Foundation. These funds will be used to purchase books and library summer reading program prizes for La Porte's summer school students. ## READ Success Story

Nancy Stephenson, READ's student intern from Brown Mackie College, has had dramatic results from her work with a seven year-old student from a Spanish-speaking background. When Nancy met her student this past March, he could barely read, did not know his numbers and was getting all F's on his report card. After talking to his teacher, Nancy decided to tutor him six days a week - an hour after school each weekday and an hour on Saturday.

Each day, Nancy had the student spell his spelling words and practice the ones he missed as homework. The pair also worked on math together. Nancy used a variety of different activities to keep her student interested, including writing a story using his spelling words, talking about school and home, playing money dominoes and drawing.

Nancy writes, "[I]f I don't let him give up on himself and make a big deal out of every accomplishment he makes it tends to keep him working hard."

Both Nancy and her student were dedicated to their work and within the first month, he went from getting all F's to getting all A's and B's! The school principal was very surprised to hear him read a story all the way to the end. Nancy is going to continue working with her student during summer school to ensure he has the skills he needs to make it through the second grade.

## What We're READING...

### A Review of M. L. Stedman's "The Light Between Two Oceans" by Greg Fruth

What happens to a moral man placed in a moral dilemma? What happens when one cannot tell the difference between right and wrong? M. L. Stedman's novel allows us to mull the answers to these questions.

Tom Sherbourne has returned from four years of war on the Western Front during World War I. Disillusioned, he seeks an environment where he can live a simple life. He returns to Australia and accepts a job as light keeper on Janus Rock, a half of a day's journey from the mainland and from the village of Partageuse, where he meets Isabel. They marry and move to Janus Rock, isolated from the world. Their love is marred when Isabel suffers two miscarriages. When a boat crashes onto the island, Tom and Isabel discover a dead man and an infant. Immediately, Tom wants to turn the baby over to the authorities, but Isabel convinces Tom that the infant is a gift. Baby Lucy becomes the light of the couple's lives.

A lighthouse exists to warn of danger, but Isabel never realizes this truth. Tom wrestles with the truth and becomes torn between right and wrong, love and morality. In turn, the reader wrestles with these values.

M. L. Stedman's first novel is riveting. Tom is well developed; Isabel, not as much. While the author allows the reader to understand Tom's dilemma, Isabel is remote, and the reader lacks a fuller empathy for the suffering mother. The plot is full of twists and turns, especially the conclusion. The stark setting becomes as significant as the characters. Stedman has produced a first novel that grabs the reader and doesn't let go until the novel is finished. She reminds us of the complexities of life and of the devastating consequences our decisions have on us.

Pick this novel up and you won't put it down until it is finished.

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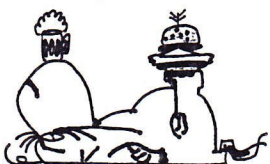
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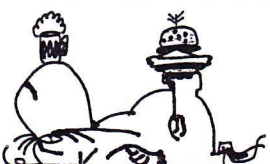
